Sent to Guantánamo after years in secret detention

Majid Khan was transferred to Guantánamo in September 2006 along with 13 other “high value” detainees. Before this, they were held in secret by the US Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) for up to four and a half years – victims of enforced disappearance. The US authorities have classified as secret the location of these clandestine detention facilities and the interrogation techniques used in them.

Majid Khan has alleged that he was tortured in CIA custody but these details also remain classified. The CIA has confirmed that it used “waterboarding”, a form of torture, as an interrogation technique against three other detainees held in secret in 2002 and 2003. To date, no one has been brought to justice for the serious abuses linked to the secret detention programme.

ACT NOW

Call on the US authorities to:

- Declassify all allegations made by Majid Khan about his treatment in CIA custody and initiate an independent criminal investigation into them.
- Release Majid Khan unless he is promptly charged and fairly tried before a federal court that excludes as evidence any information obtained under torture or other ill-treatment.
