SINGAPORE: CHIN Seow Noi, aged 33 (f)
CHIN Yau Kim, aged 31
NG Kim Heng, aged 30

Amnesty International has only just learnt that Chin Seow Noi, her brother Chin Yau Kim and Ng Kim Heng were sentenced to death in October 1992 for the murder of a woman committed in January 1989.

Their appeal to the Court of Criminal Appeal was rejected in May 1993 and the grounds for this decision were published in December 1993:

The Court of Criminal Appeal ruled that Section 30 of the Evidence Act should be given a wider interpretation. A person can now be convicted solely on the confession of a co-accused, even if there is no other independent evidence against the accused.

A final appeal will now be made to the President who can confirm or reverse the death sentences.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Amnesty International opposes the death penalty in all cases as a violation of the right to life and the right not to be subjected to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment, as proclaimed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Please send telegrams/telexes/faxes/express and airmail letters either in English or in your own language:

- expressing concern at the imposition of the death sentence on Chin Seow Noi, Chin Yau Kim and Ng Kim Heng and urging the President of Singapore to commute these death sentences;

- stating Amnesty International's unconditional opposition to the death penalty, and urging that all existing death sentences be commuted and that no more be imposed in the future.
