

ABDUCTED FOR EXPOSING DISAPPEARANCES

Described by his daughters as an "enthusiastic but terrible" cook, Idris Khattak is Pakistan's expert on enforced disappearances. He's spent years documenting them for Amnesty International and Human Rights Watch. But in November 2019, Idris, too, disappeared.

After his daughter, Talia, bravely went public calling for her father's release, the authorities admitted they had him. Now Idris could be charged with espionage, which could mean 14 years in jail or a death sentence.
