

السعودية: اجتثاث المُعارَضة

منظمة العفو الدولية:

مذكرة معلومات مُقدِّمة في إطار الدورة الخامسة والأربعين للفريق العامل المعني بالاستعراض الدوري الشامل، يناير/كانون الثاني - فبراير/شباط 2024

ملخص

أُعِدَّت مذكرة المعلومات هذه من أجل الاستعراض الدوري الشامل لسجل السعودية، المُقرر إجراؤه خلال يناير/كانون الثاني وفبراير/شباط 2024. وتقيّم منظمة العفو الدولية فيها مدى تنفيذ التوصيات التي قُدمت إلى السعودية في الاستعراض الدوري الشامل السابق لسجلها، بما فيها تلك المتعلقة بحرية التعبير وتكوين الجمعيات أو الانضمام إليها والتجمع السلمي وعقوبة الإعدام وحقوق المرأة.

وتُقيِّم المنظمة أيضًا الإطار الوطني لحقوق الإنسـان فيما يتعلق بالأنظمة واللوائح التنظيمية الجديدة ذات الصلة بحقوق المرأة وحقوق العمال وحقوق الطفل.

وتُعرِب منظمة العفو الدولية عن بواعث القلق بشأن تصاعد قمع حرية التعبير وتزايد استخدام نظامي مكافحة جرائم المعلوماتية وجرائم الإرهاب لإسكات المُعارَضة؛ وكذلك بشأن مقاضاة المدافعات عن حقوق الإنسان؛ واستمرار انتهاكات الإجراءات القانونية الواجب اِتّباعها والمحاكمات الجائرة أمام المحكمة الجزائية المتخصصة؛ وارتفاع أعداد عمليات الإعدام المُنقَّذة؛ وتقنين التمييز المجحف بحق المرأة عبر نظام جديد للأحوال الشخصية؛ واستمرار الاحتجاز التعسفي والترحيل القسري لعمال مهاجرين؛ والإخلاء القسري لآلاف السكان في إطار خطة لتطوير مدينة جدة؛ والانتهاكات التي يرتكبها التحالف العسكري بقيادة السعودية في اليمن.

وتُختَتَم هذه المذكرة بمجموعة من التوصيات المُوجَّهة إلى السعودية، والتي من شأنها، في حال تنفيذها، أن تُساهم في تحسين أوضاع حقوق الإنسان في البلاد.

متابعة للاستعراض السابق

- 1. أيَّدت السعودية 182 توصية، خلال الاستعراض الدوري الشامل الثالث لسجلها في نوفمبر/تشرين الثاني 2018، وأحاطت علمًا بـ76 توصية.1
 - ترحب منظمة العفو الدولية بإجراء بعض الإصلاحات لصالح حقوق المرآة في السعودية، بما في ذلك إزالة قيود صارمة فُرِضَت على حقوق المرأة عبر نظام ولاية الرجل. وعلى الرغم من أن هذه الإصلاحات كان لها بعض الآثار الإيجابية على حقوق المرأة وحرية النساء في التنقل، فإن المنظمة تأسف لعدم إلغاء الإصلاحات لنظام ولاية الرجل بالكامل بما يتماشى مع التوصيات المُؤيَّدة.²
- 3. للأسف، لم تُنفّذ السعودية العديد من التوصيات التي أيّدتها في الاستعراض السابق، بما فيها تلك المتعلقة بمواءمة نظامَيْ مكافحة جرائم المعلوماتية وجرائم الإرهاب لديها مع المعايير الدولية، وضمان وحماية الحقوق في حرية التعبير وتكوين الجمعيات أو الانضمام إليها والتجمع السلمي، والإفراج عن مدافعي حقوق الإنسان وجميع من سُجنوا بسبب ممارسة حقوقهم في حرية التعبير وتكوين الجمعيات أو الانضمام إليها والتجمع السلمي، وضمان اتخاذ الإجراءات القانونية الواجبة وعقد محاكمات عادلة، وحماية العمال من جميع أنواع إساءة المعاملة. 6
- 4. ومما يبعث على خيبة الأمل أن السعودية قد أحاطت علمًا بالتوصيات بشأن انضمامها لتكون طرفًا في نظام روما الأساسي للمحكمة الجنائية الدولية⁷ والعهد الدولي الخاص بالحقوق الاقتصادية والاجتماعية والثقافية والعهد الدولي الخاص بالحقوق المدنية والسياسية؛⁸ وكذلك بشأن سحب تحفظاتها على اتفاقية القضاء على جميع أشكال التمييز ضد المرأة؛⁹ ورفعها للحظر على التظاهرات وإنهاء تجريمها؛¹⁰ وفرضها وقف لتنفيذ عقوبة الإعدام، تمهيدًا لإلغائها بالكامل.¹¹ ولا تزال هذه التوصيات مهمة وملائمة، ومن شأنها، في حال تنفيذها، أن تُساهم في تحسين أوضاع حقوق الإنسان في السادة

الإطار الوطني لحقوق الإنسان

حقوق المرأة

- 5. في أغسطس/آب 2019، نفَّذت السلطات السعودية إصلاحات كبرى على نظام ولاية الرجل، بما فيها السماح للنساء اللواتي تتجاوز أعمارهن 21 عامًا باستخراج جوازات السفر والسفر بدون إذن أوليائهن من الذكور؛ والسماح للنساء اللواتي تتجاوز أعمارهن 18 عامًا بتسجيل ولادة مولود حديث الولادة ووفاة أقاربهن وزواجهن أو طلاقهن، وكذلك باستخراج سجل الأسرة؛ والسماح للنساء أن يتصرفن كربّات للأسرة. 12 ولكن لا يزال نظام الولاية ساري المفعول في جوانب عديدة في حياة النساء.
- 6. وقد أصدرت السعودية في مارس/آذار 2022 نظام الأحوال الشخصية الأول في البلاد. وفي حين أن النظام قد جاء ببعض الإصلاحات الإيجابية، كوضع حدّ أدنى لسـن الزواج، إلا أنه يُرسّخ نظامًا من التمييز القائم على النوع الاجتماعي في معظم جوانب الحياة الأسـرية.¹³
- 7. فبموجب نظام الأحوال الشخصية، النساء لا يزلن بحاجة إلى موافقة أوليائهن القانونيين من الذكور كي يتزوجن. وخلال الزواج، يُتوقع من المرأة "طاعة" زوجها، ويُشترط أن "تُمكنّه من نفسها" للحصول على حقها في الدعم المالي، بما في ذلك الطعام والسكن. وتُعرّض هذه الأحكام النساء لخطر إساءة المعاملة، بما في ذلك الاغتصاب الزوجي الذي لا يُجرِّمه القانون السعودي. ويجوز للرجال فقط الشروع في الطلاق بدون أي شروط، بينما تواجه النساء عوائق قانونية ومالية وعملية، حين يردن حل زواجهن. أما في حالة الانفصال بين الزوجين، فلا تحظى الأم بالحقوق فيما يخص المسائل المتعلقة بأطفالها على قدم المساواة مع الأب. ويمنح نظام الأحوال الشخصية أيضًا الرجال نصيبًا أكبر بكثير من نصيب النساء في الأصول الموروثة.

الأطفال المخالفون للقانون

8. في أغسطس/آب 2018، أصدر الملك سلمان نظام الأحداث الذي ينص على عقوبة السجن لمدة 10 أعوام كحد أقصى للأطفال في الحالات التي يُرتكَب فيها جرائم يُعاقَب عليها للأطفال في الحالات التي يُرتكَب فيها جرائم يُعاقَب عليها بالإعدام وفقًا للشريعة الإسلامية. 14 إلا أن هذا النظام لا يمنع القضاة من إصدار أحكام الإعدام على الأطفال المخالفين للقانون في حالة ارتكاب جرائم الحد (تلك التي تنطوي على عقوبات ثابتة وقاسية بموجب الشريعة)، أو جرائم يعاقب



عليها بالقصاص.

9. في أبريل/نيسان 2020، أُعلِن في أمر ملكي إنهاء استخدام عقوبة الإعدام ضد الأشخاص الذين كانت أعمارهم دون الـ 18 عامًا في وقت وقوع الجريمة في الحالات التعزيرية، التي لا يَرِد بشأنها عقوبات ثابتة في الشريعة الإسلامية.¹⁵ واستثنى الأمر الملكي أي أشخاص صدر بحقهم أحكام بموجب نظام مكافحة جرائم الإرهاب.

الإصلاحات الخاصة بحقوق العمال

- 10. لا يزال العمال المهاجرون يخضعون لنظام الكفالة، الذي يمنح أصحاب العمل سلطة كبيرة جدًا عليهم. فقد أعلنت وزارة الموارد البشرية والتنمية الاجتماعية، في مارس/ آذار 2021، إجراء إصلاحات محدودة على نظام الكفالة، من بينها السماح للعمال المهاجرين بمغادرة البلاد وترك وظائفهم بدون إذن من أصحاب عملهم، إذا استوفوا شروطًا معينة.¹⁶ وتنص الإصلاحات أيضًا على أنه يجوز للعمال المهاجرين تقديم طلبات عبر الإنترنت للحصول على تأشيرات خروج من الوزارة، ويتمّ إطلاع أصحاب العمل على هذه الطلبات. إلا أن عدم الوضوح لا يزال يكتنف معايير قبول طلبات الحصول على تصاريح الخروج، وتستثني هذه الإصلاحات العمالة المنزلية.
 - 11. في يوليو/تموز 2022، أعلنت الوزارة شرطَيْن جديدَيْن، يجوز بموجبهما للعمال والعاملات المنزليين تغيير صاحب العمل بدون الحصول على تصريح من صاحب عملهم الحالي: أولهما إذا أنهى الموظّف أو الموظّفة عقد العمل في أثناء فترة التدريب، وثانيهما إذا توفَّر إثبات بأن خدمات الموظّف أو الموظفة قد انتقلت منذ وقت سابق إلى صاحب عمل آخر، بدون علم أو موافقة صاحب العمل السابق. واستمر استثناء العمال والعاملات المنزليين المهاجرين من إجراءات الحماية المنصوص عليها في قانون العمل السعودي.¹⁷

عدم وجود قانون للعقوبات

12. على الرغم من وعود ولي العهد الأمير محمد بن سلمان بسنّ قانون جديد للعقوبات، في إطار حزمة من الإصلاحات التشريعية لـ"حماية حقوق الإنسان"، لم يُصدَر أي قانون للعقوبات حتى الآن. ¹⁸

حالة حقوق الإنسان على أرض الواقع

قمع حرية التعبير وتكوين الجمعيات أو الانضمام إليها والتجمع السلمى

- 13. منذ عام 2018، صعّدت السلطات السعودية قمعها لجميع أشكال المُعارَضة، سواءً على شبكة الإنترنت أو خارجها. 19 فقد تعرض جميع المدافعين عن حقوق الإنسان والنشطاء والصحفيين المستقلين والكُتّاب في البلاد تقريبًا للاحتجاز التعسفي، وأُخضعوا لمحاكمات جائرة ومُطوَّلة، عُقدت في أغلب الأحيان أمام المحكمة الجزائية المتخصصة، وحُكم عليهم بالسجن لفترات مُطوَّلة أو أُفرِج عنهم ولكن بشروط تضمنت المنع من السفر وقيودًا تعسفية أخرى على حقوقهم الإنسانية، بما في ذلك تقييد قدرتهم على ممارسة نشاط السلمي. إضافة إلى ذلك، واصلت السلطات منعها لتشكيل الأحزاب السياسية أو النقابات العمالية أو مجموعات حقوق الإنسان المستقلة، بينما ظلت جميع الاحتجاجات محظورة، بما في ذلك المظاهرات السلمية. 20
- 14. بحلول يونيو/حزيران 2023، وثّقت منظمة العفو الدولية حالات 68 شخصًا لُوحِقوا قضائيًا بسبب ممارسة حقوقهم في حرية التعبير وتكوين الجمعيات أو الانضمام إليها والتجمع السلمي. ويُسجَن من بينهم خمسة وأربعون شخصًا في الوقت الحالي، بينما أُفرِج عن الـ23 الآخرين إفراجًا مشروطًا، إما بعد أن قضوا فترات السجن المحكوم بها عليهم أو ريثما تنعقد محاكماتهم.
- 15. وفي 9 أغسطس/آب 2022، حكمت المحكمة الجزائية المتخصصة على امرأة سعودية بالسجن لمدة 45 عامًا، يليها منع من السفر لمدة 45 عامًا بسبب آراء نشرتها على تويتر. ويُعتقَد أن هذه أطول مدة سجن يُحكَم بها على امرأة سعودية بسبب التعبير السلمي في تاريخ البلاد. ²¹
 - 16. زادت السلطات من مدة أحكام السجن على أشخاص يقضون حاليًا فترات السجن التي حُكِم بها عليهم أو على أولئك الذين كانوا قد سُجِنوا سابقًا بسبب عملهم في مجال حقوق الإنسان.²²
- 17. ومنذ أكتوبر/تشرين الأول 2022، تحتجز السلطات السعودية محمد القحطاني، أحد الأعضاء المؤسسين لجمعية الحقوق المدنية والسياسية في السعودية (حسم) المنحلّة، الذي حُكِم عليه بتهم إرهاب مشكوك فيها - وهو يُحتَجَز بمعزل عن العالم الخارجي، على الرغم من انقضاء فترة محكوميته في نوفمبر/تشرين الثاني 2022.²³



المحاكمات الجائرة

18. واصلت السلطات إسكات المُعارَضة بإصدار أحكام بإدانة وسجن أشخاص في أعقاب محاكمات فادحة الجور أمام المحكمة الجزائية المتخصصة، التي أُنشِئَت لمحاكمة الأشخاص على جرائم الإرهاب، بتهم مُبهمة الصياغة وكثيرًا ما تُساوي بين التعبير السلمي والإرهاب. وفي معظم الحالات التي اطّلعت عليها منظمة العفو الدولية، أُعتُقِل المتهمون بدون مذكرة اعتقال وبدون اطلاعهم على التهم المُوجَّهة إليهم؛ واُحتُجِزوا بمعزل عن العالم الخارجي، وفي كثير من الأحيان في الحبس الانفرادي، بدون السماح لهم بالتواصل مع أسرهم أو مع محام؛ وتعرَّضوا للتعذيب أو غيره من ضروب المعاملة السيئة خلال فترة حبسهم الاحتياطي؛ واحتُجزوا بدون توجيه أي تهم إليهم أو محاكمتهم، ولم تُتَح أمامهم أي فرصة للطعن في قانونية احتجازهم؛ وأُدينوا، وفي كثير من الحالات، حُكِم عليهم إما بالسجن لفترات طويلة أو بالإعدام، على خلفية تهم مبهمة وفضفاضة الصياغة تُجرِّم المُعارَضة السلمية باعتبارها "إرهاب".²⁴

عقوبة الإعدام

- 19. على الرغم من وعود السلطات السعودية بالحد من استخدام عقوبة الإعدام، فإنها أعدمت 556 شخصًا بين 5 نوفمبر/تشرين الثاني 2018 ويونيو/حزيران 2023. وفي رد هيئة حقوق الإنسان السعودية على طلب منظمة العفو الدولية لمعلومات حول استخدام عقوبة الإعدام، أعلمت المنظمة بإعدام 196 شخصًا في 2022. ويُعد ذلك ارتفاعًا شديدًا في عدد عمليات الإعدام، مقارنةً بعددها في عام 2021، وهو 67، وفي عام 2020، وهو 27. وإن عدد عمليات الإعدام المُنفَّذة في 2022 أعلى بكثير من العدد الذي ذكرته وكالة الأنباء السعودية الرسمية، ما يثير بواعث قلق بالغ حيال غياب الشفافية في البلاد فيما يخص استخدام عقوبة الإعدام.²⁵
 - 20. في يناير/كانون الثاني 2021، أعلنت هيئة حقوق الإنسان السعودية وقف تنفيذ عمليات الإعدام للمعاقبة على الجرائم المتعلقة بالمخدرات.²⁶ إلا أن السلطات استأنفت تنفيذ مثل هذه العمليات في نوفمبر/تشرين الثاني 2022، لتُعدِم 57 شخصًا على خلفية جرائم متعلقة بالمُخدِّرات بحلول نهاية 2022.²⁷
 - 21. في أغسطس/آب 2021، خففت المحكمة الجزائية المتخصصة أحكام الإعدام الصادرة بحق ثلاثة نشطاء شبان من الطائفة الشيعية اُعتُقِلوا جميعًا حينما كانوا أطفالًا في 2012 واُتُهِموا بارتكاب جرائم تتعلق بمشاركتهم في احتجاجات مُناهِضة للحكومة. وأُعِيد الحكم على الشبان الثلاثة بالسجن لمدة 10 أعوام، تشمل المدة التي سبق أن أمضوها في السجن، بما يتماشي مع نظام الأحداث.²⁸
- 22. على الرغم من الإصلاحات القانونية الرامية إلى الحد من إعدام أشخاص كانت أعمارهم دون الـ 18 عامًا وقت وقوع الجرائم، وثَّقت منظمة العفو الدولية حالات سبعة شبان أيّدت محكمة الاستئناف الجزائية المتخصصة أحكام إعدامهم بين مارس/آذار 2022 ومارس/آذار 2023، على خلفية جرائم وقعت عندما كانت أعمارهم دون الـ 18 عامًا.²⁹
- 23. وفي مارس/آذار 2022، نفَّذت السلطات أكبر عملية إعدام جماعية منذ أعوام بحق 81 شخصًا كانوا قد أُدينوا بمجموعة واسعة من التهم، تضمنت تهم بارتكاب جرائم متعلقة بالإرهاب وتهم من قبيل "الدعوة إلى والمشاركة في الاعتصامات والمظاهرات". وكان واحد وأربعون شخصًا من بين الذين أُعدموا ينتمون إلى الأقلية الشيعية في السعودية، التي يتعرَّض أفرادها للتمييز المجحف والمضايقات بصورة معتادة بسبب معارضتهم للحكومة.³⁰

حقوق المرأة

- 24. على الرغم من إجراء بعض الإصلاحات، لا تزال النساء في السعودية يتَعَرَّضن للتمييز المجحف، سواءً في القانون أو في الواقع الفعلي. بالإضافة إلى ذلك، لا تزال النساء والفتيات يفتقرن إلى الحماية الكافية من التعرُّض للعنف الجنسي وغيره من أشكال العنف.³¹
- 25. وبين مايو/أيار واغسطس/أب 2018، شنت السلطات موجة من الاعتقالات استهدفت المدافعات عن حقوق الإنسان؛ وكان من بين المُعتَقَلات 13 من ناشطات حقوق المرأة كُنَّ قد شاركن في حملات ضد الحظر المفروض على قيادة النساء للسيارات ونظام ولاية الرجل؛ وكانت من بينهن لُجين الهذلول. وفي خلال الأشهر الثلاثة الأولى من احتجازهن، تعرَّض العديد من الناشطات للتعذيب والاعتداء الجنسي وغير ذلك من ضروب المعاملة السيئة، حينما كُنَّ مُحتَجَزات بمعزل عن العالم الخارجي ورهن الحبس الانفرادي، بدون أن تُتاح لهن إمكانية التواصل مع أسرهن أو محاميهن. وأُصدِرَت أحكام على العديد من النساء بتهم الاتصال بوسائل إعلام أجنبية ونشطاء آخرين ومنظمات دولية، من بينها منظمة العفو الدولية. وأفرج عن جميع ناشطات حقوق المرأة الـ13 إفراجًا مشروطًا ويقضين حاليًا مدد منع من السفر مماثلة لمدد الأحكام بسجنهن.



عمليات الإخلاء القسري

26. خلال الفترة بين يناير/كانون الثاني وأكتوبر/تشرين الأول 2022، أخضعت السلطات آلاف السكان، بما في ذلك أجانب، في مدينة جدة الساحلية لعمليات إخلاء قسري، في إطار خطة لتطوير المدينة. وفي 31 يناير/كانون الثاني 2022، أعلنت إحدى منافذ الإعلام الموالية للدولة عن برنامج لتعويض المواطنين استثنى الأجانب الذين مثّلوا 47% من السكان الذين أُخلُوا من منازلهم. وكان السكان قد تلقوا إخطارات مسبقة قبل مدد تراوحت بين يوم واحد وستة أسابيع. وكانت خطط المشروع قد أنهيت قبل نحو ثلاثة أعوام، إلا أن السلطات لم تُجرِ مشاورات حقيقية مع السكان، ولم تُقدم لهم إخطارات مُسبقة قبل مدة كافية، ولم تُعلن عن قيمة التعويضات، ولم تقدم هذه التعويضات لهم قبل عمليات الهدم.³³

العمال المهاجرون

27. واصلت السلطات قمعها للأشخاص المتهمين بانتهاك أنظمة الإقامة والحدود والعمل بطرق تضمنت الاحتجاز والإعادة القسرية. فقد عرّضت عشرات الآلاف من المهاجرين غير النظاميين، لا سيما الإثيوبيين، للاعتقال التعسفي والتعذيب وغيره من ضروب المعاملة السيئة والاحتجاز التعسفي لفترات مُطوَّلة، بدون اتخاذ الإجراءات القانونية الواجب اِتّباعها في ظروف لاإنسانية حاطّة بالكرامة، افتقرت إلى ما يكفي من الطعام ومرافق الصرف الصحي وأماكن الإقامة والرعاية الصحية.³3

النزاع المسلح في اليمن

- 28. بين **2018** و2022، وثَّقت منظمة العفو الدولية العديد من الضربات الجوية التي شـنّها التحالف بقيادة السعودية على المدنيين ومنشآت البنية التحتية المدنية في اليمن، بما فيها مباني الاتصالات والمنازل والمستشفيات والمدارس، ما أسـفر عن مقتل مدنيين، تضمنوا أطفالًا. وقد ترقى هذه الهجمات إلى مسـتوى جرائم الحرب.^{36 36}
- 29. وفي يوليو/تموز 2018، أصدر الملك سلمان مرسومًا ملكيًا يمنح عفوًا عامًا عن جميع العسكريين الذين شاركوا في النزاع اليمني، ما يُعَد انتهاكًا لالتزامات السعودية بموجب القانون الدولي.³⁷
- 30. وفي أكتوبر/تشرين الأول 2021، أدت الجهود المُكثّفة بقيادة السعودية لممارسة الضغط أمام مجلس حقوق الإنسان إلى إنهاء عمل فريق خبراء الأمم المتحدة البارزين، الذي يُعَد الآلية الدولية الوحيدة للتحقيق بصورة محايدة بشأن انتهاكات القانون الإنساني الدولي في اليمن.³⁸

توصيات باتخاذ إجراءات موجهة إلى الدولة موضع الاستعراض

تدعو منظمة العفو الدولية حكومة السعودية إلى ما يلي:

الالتزامات الدولية بشأن حقوق الإنسان

- 31. التصديق، بدون إبداء أي تحفظات، على العهد الدولي الخاص بالحقوق المدنية والسياسية، والعهد الدولي الخاص بالحقوق الاقتصادية والاجتماعية والثقافية، والاتفاقية الدولية لحماية جميع الأشخاص من الاختفاء القسري، ونظام روما الأساسـي للمحكمة الجنائية الدولية، وتنفيذ العهدين والاتفاقية والنظام بالكامل في إطار أنظمتها المحلية.






